# **GUIDELINES FOR BUSKING IN JERSEY**

Issued by the Jersey Arts Centre - January 2022

It is a legal requirement that those busking in the island obtain a permit, which is to be issued by the Bailiff. The Jersey Arts Centre is responsible for administering the application process for busking permits. This document explains how to apply for a permit and gives guidelines to assist in the continued smooth running of the scheme.

#### PERMIT APPLICATION PROCEDURE

### All applicants should read the following guidelines

### **New Applicants**

Complete this form and send to Hettie Duncan, Education & Outreach Coordinator, Jersey Arts Centre, Phillips Street, St. Helier JE2 4SW or mac@artscentre.je You will then be contacted to arrange a time to attend an informal audition to ensure the content and quality are suitable for public performance.

#### **Audition**

Please bring a passport sized photograph. Following a successful audition and payment of the permit fee, your application will then be forwarded to the Bailiff's Chambers. If everything is in order, the Bailiff's Chambers will send you the permit.

There is no need to re-audition if you have completed one previously.

Performers in possession of a permit that expires 31 December in the year of issue

It usually takes a minimum of 10 working days to obtain a Permit. No busking / entertaining is permitted until you are in receipt of your Permit.

#### PERMIT ENTITLEMENT

The Busking Permit entitles you to busk from 1 January - 31 December in the year of issue, island wide (with a few exceptions).

The permit entitles you to busk around the island. Popular sites include: St. Helier

- Don Street Junction near USC
- The Apple Crush in front of M&S (NOT in the doorway to the right)
- Corner of Bath Street and Queen Street
- Outside the Exeter Pub
- Pedestrian area in Colomberie
- West Centre
- Liberation Square

- Parade Gardens
- Paved area outside Maritime Museum
- Paved area surrounding the Steam Clock
- Les Jardins de la Mer
- Millennium Town Park

#### Grouville

Gorey Harbour / around bus stop (not the pier)

#### St. Brelade

- Area around St. Aubin's Parish Hall
- Winston Churchill Gardens

### **Other**

 Busking may be performed at other locations provided that any residents or shopkeepers do not object and that all guidelines are observed.

**Please note:** The Royal Square should be avoided due to the Royal Courts, States Sittings and the Registry Office. However, it can be used 6pm – 9.30pm.

## **Busking is NOT permitted:**

- Near Pearce Jewellers
- Outside Voisins
- Liberty Wharf
- On private land without permission of the owner
- At organised events without permission of the event organiser
- Please DO NOT busk outside Hammons or Rivoli Jewellers during office hours (Mon - Fri 9am - 5pm)

## PERFORMANCE GUIDELINES

- No performance may contain anything that could be considered offensive by the public.
- Due consideration must be given to those living or working near popular busking sites. For this reason it is a requirement that you do not perform for more than 30 minutes at any one site before moving on, particularly in the centre of town. Buskers should not return to a site within 1 hour and should ideally never busk within 30 minutes of another busker vacating a site. In other areas, especially those well away from residential and commercial property, these times are a little more flexible. However, when busking at any location you are asked to show consideration for others.
- The use of amplified musical instruments or sound systems is not permitted.
- Please ensure that you do not obstruct doorways, thoroughfares o shop window displays and be sensitive to alfresco dining areas in town.
- Occasionally there will be groups scheduled by Jersey arts centre and other
  organising bodies to appear at a particular location at a specific time; please
  recognise this by vacating any such sites if requested.
- Applicants under 17 must be accompanied by an adult when performing, for their own safety.
- When busking you should not use, rearrange or block from use any street furniture.

#### **BAILIFF'S PERMIT**

All Permits for Busking are issued by the Bailiff.

if a permit is issued, you will be able to entertain for remuneration from the public as well as sell recordings of **your own** (and only your own) performances.

- The permit allows busking from 9.00am until 9.30pm, daily.
- A permit may be refused or may be withdrawn on the request of the Bailiff or the Jersey Arts Centre – no refund will be issued.
- Only those whose names (or Group) are specified on a permit are allowed to entertain.
- The Permit is not transferable.
- The laminated Permit must be displayed in a visible place at all times when performing.

A copy of your Bailiff's Permit will be circulated to the States Police, the Town Hall and other relevant official bodies. Your Bailiff's Permit (in addition to your laminated permit) should be available upon request from any official.

Management of the Permits is facilitated by the Jersey Arts Centre to ensure the co-ordination and circulation of performers' details are given to the relevant authorities in the Island to ensure the smooth running of the busking scheme.

Where performers have given their approval, the Jersey Arts Centre may also circulate details of performers to local event organisers who may be seeking artists for private function. However, participants need to have given their permission on the application form for their details to be included on this database.

#### PERMIT FEE

The permit fee has been waivered on a trial basis for 2022.

In addition – no donations need to be made to charity as in previous years.

### COVID-19

- Buskers must at all times follow government guidelines on Covid-19.
- Buskers must be vigilant in busking in areas where members of the public can pass at a safe distance.
- If crowds begin to form the busker should remind the public to keep a safe distance.
