The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)...

... is a human rights treaty, introduced by the United Nations (UN) in 1989. It sets out a list of rights that belong to every child and young person under 18 years of age.

The UNCRC's aim is to recognise the rights of children and young people and ensure that they grow up 'in the spirit of peace, dignity, tolerance, freedom, equality and solidarity'.

All UN member states (except for the United States) have ratified the Convention, making it the most widely supported human rights treaty in history.

In June 2014, Jersey became a State Party to the UNCRC, when it asked for the UK's ratification to be extended to the Island. As a Crown Dependency, Jersey is unable to independently sign or ratify international treaties, so must do this through the UK.

The Convention has 54 articles in total. Articles 43–54 are about how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights,

ARTICLE 31

Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities

To this end, the *playdays* festival has created **Article 31 Tickets** whereby children and their families who might not otherwise be able to access the activities and performances of the *playdays* festival, can do so if they are being supported in any way by: **Brighter Futures, Barnardo's, Every Child Our Future, Liberate** and **mind Jersey**.




PREVIEW: MONDAY 30 JUNE 5.30PM - 7PM

Larry Hayes: The Nightmares of Finnegan Quick


SATURDAY 19 JULY 2PM (60 MINS)

Charlie Lowe was a young actor and a member of Jersey Arts Centre's Junior Drama Group who died tragically with his father, Dean Lowe, in August 2023. Charlie's mum, Ashleigh Le Boutillier, will be presenting his award at the ceremony on 26 July.

Jersey Arts Centre employees are not eligible for an award. A recipient may only receive one award. The 2025 *playdays* awards will be announced at 3pm on Saturday 26 July from the Jersey Arts Centre stage.
